# Quarter better than expected, Core profits up 10% YoY

ICICI reported a quarter better than expectation with 1) an advance growth of 12% YoY, 2) NIM expansion by 14bps QoQ to 3.3%, 3) growth in core profits by 10% YoY, 4) lower credit cost coupled with compression in GNPA by 27 bps to 8.5% coupled with improving coverage, 5) favorable credit risk profile, with A- and above book increasing to 65.5% vs 63.3%, fall in BB and below by 12% QoQ and in drill down list as well. With robust momentum in retail advance growth, increasing pricing power and largely at the end of the provision cycle of its legacy bad book, it is well placed than its corporate peers. However, a substantial improvement in profitability is expected to be driven by material recoveries.

# Drilldown list down, GNPA improved, likely to trend down

The drill down list fell 25% and the BB portfolio fell 12% - due to recovery of one lumpy assets amongst others. We are factoring in GNPA to fall to 8.6% by with PCR at 70% on account of recoveries and resolution — which is a monitorable. We are cautiously watchful of the low rated book.

### Heathy Retail asset growth + pass-through = NIM expansion

Advances grew 12% YoY, one of the strongest tractions in recent times driven by a robust growth in retail and SME. Within retail, unsecured loans grew at 43% led by personal loans. This coupled with pass through ability of higher costs, increasing share of lower cost deposits and interest reversal aided NIM expansion by 27 bps YoY. The momentum in retail growth is expected to continue, however the traction in corporate is likely to materially return only post-election. Currently we are factoring CAGR 13% growth in advances. Higher share of retail and better pricing power is likely to enable NIM expansion by ~20 bps by FY20E.

# With CAGR 22% in earnings and RoE expansion by 10 bps by FY20E - Accumulate at 2.7x FY20E P/ABV

An improvement in profitability, from hereon, is expected to be driven by material recoveries. We are likely to remain cautious on the power portfolio and movement in its low rated assets. Towards its ageing and provisions cycle, it is at the end of the cycle with a PCR touching (ex technical write off)  $^{\sim}60\%$ . The momentum in retail growth is expected to continue, we believe the corporate growth is likely to be witness material traction in line with the turn of investment cycle post-election.

# **Concall Highlights**

#### **Advances**

- Loan book grew 13% YoY largely led by retail segment.
- Mortgage grew 16% YoY, auto grew 10% YoY, business banking grew 45% YoY & Rural grew 19% YoY.
- Unsecured loans grew 43% YoY and now constitutes 6.5% of total loans.
- Opportunity to cross sell unsecured loans to existing customers exist and expect to growth retail book by ~15% in FY19.
- A- & above to 65% vs 63.3%.

# **Overseas book**

- Overseas book continues to de-grow and now stands at 12.7%. GNPA significantly high.
- NIM marginally positive due to interest reversal in recovery but collection is key.

### **NBFCs and HFC:**

Exposure to NBFCs & HFCs (fund based + non fund + investment) at ₹ 367.34bn (5.4% of total loans) of which NBFC is ₹ 241.9 bn and HFC at 125.44 bn growing 10% and 23% YoY respectively.

# **Exposure to II&FS:**

 Didn't declare the amount but downgraded a similar account outstanding at ₹ 8.21 bn amongst others.

# **Exposure to power sector**

Of the total exposure 30% is NPA, drilldown and restructured. Of the balance 70%, 53% is private sector and 47% is public sector and ₹ 16.14 bn is towards SEB. 81% is A- and above.

# **Liabilities and Liquidity**

- Deposits grew 12% YoY driven by strong growth in CASA deposits. Average CASA deposit mix improved by 100bps and stood at 47.1% with growth of 15.4% YoY.
- CA witnessed slight weakness in Q2FY19 while traction from retail term deposits improving.
- Wholesale term deposits above 8% in line with CD rates but is a smaller share.
- Funding profile healthy now. Liquidity low in the system, may have to rely on wholesale deposits in H2.
- In H2FY19 liquidity expected to remain tighter and banks will have to depend on term deposits.
- LCR higher than regulator's requirement at ~110%.





#### Fee Income

- Fee income grew 16.5% YoY which includes dividend income from subsidiaries of ₹ 1.67bn.
- Core operating PAT excl dividend from subsidiaries grew 17% YoY.
- Focus will be on improving core operating PAT. RoE target of 15%.

# **Pricing and contribution**

- Margins improved by 14bps sequentially to 3.33% with an improvement in yields to 8.79% and with higher recoveries.
- Increase in CASA share led to a decline in cost of deposits.
- Cost of funds stable at 5% QoQ but likely to elevate in H2FY19.
- Pricing power improving and can pass through the costs.
- FY20 will be more stable in terms of margins.

### **Asset Quality**

- Slippages moderated to ₹ 31bn out of which 13bn was due to currency depreciation and ₹ 10 bn from BB & below rated portfolio.
- Recoveries and upgrades during the quarter were ₹ 10bn (₹ 20bn in Q1FY19).
- Drilldown list exposure declined to 32.8bn (₹ 44bn Q1FY19) with recovery of one large steel account (₹ 19bn) offset by addition of ₹ 8 bn of IIL&FS exposure (likely).
- Bulk of the exposure in power.
- BB & below corporate & SME portfolio has been declined to ₹ 217.8bn (₹ 246.2bn).
- Slippages in FY19 to be lower than it was in FY18.
- Loans under RBI resolution schemes 5/25 & S4A stands at ₹ 25.58bn.

#### **Credit Cost**

- Provisions declined by 11% on sequential basis to ₹ 39.9bn (₹ 59.7bn in Q1FY19).
- Target PCR of 70% by FY19
- NCLT exposure:
  - > Exposure to accounts in NCLT list 1 is ₹ 38.8bn with PCR of 90% and
  - > NCLT list 2 is ₹ 94bn with PCR of 62%.
