Recovery on course, Compelling Valuations

ITC reported healthy 6% cigarette volume growth and 8.7% EBIT growth on QoQ improvement in cigarette demand. This has been the highest volume growth since 4QFY12 (6%). Recovery in demand, stabilization of sales mix and cigarette prices and stable taxation regime can result in gradual recovery post 17% decline in volumes in past 5 years. We expect FMCG business led by processed foods to show steady increase in profitability given that some of the businesses like Biscuits and Atta have achieved economies of scale and personal care is stabilizing, however Lifestyle retailing would remain a drag. Paperboard margins are expected to improve given benign input costs and revamp of the 1.5 lakh TPA value added paperboard machine. We expect higher ARR, occupancy rates and growth in F&B sales to improve profitability in Hotels. However, Agri business led by leaf tobacco would take time to recover, despite some relief from INR depreciation. ITC trades at 22.5xSept EPS, 35-40% discount to our coverage universe, which limits downside in the stock. Retain "Buy" with SOTP based target price of Rs364 (Rs364 earlier). Steep increase in cigarette taxes are a key risk to our call.

- Cigarettes volumes up 6%, EBIT up 8.7%: Cigarette business reported 6% volume growth, highest growth post 4QFY12. Mix remains stable has stabilized with 64mm segment at 37-38% of volumes. Stability in GST rates remains key for sustained recovery in cigarette volumes; our estimates factor in 3% cigarette volume growth for FY18-20. Margins have seen a hit of 100bps on account of damaged stock due to floods in Kerala and expenses on implementation of new pictorial warnings. ITC has also increased prices of Flake filter in the RSFT segment, first one after several quarters.
- FMCG EBIDTA margin at 5%: Adj. Sales grew 12.7%. EBITDA grew 76.9% to Rs1.59bn. EBIT at Rs584.5mn increased 185.3% with market share enhancement in most of the categories. Foods, personal care and stationary have reported improved performance while Lifestyle retailing remains a drag.
- Hotels margin up on higher ARR and Occupancy levels: EBIT increased 267% on 20.8% increase in sales and 290bps margin expansion led by improvement in ARR, higher occupancy levels and strong growth in F&B sales. Hotels business is expected to report steady improvement in coming quarters.
- Paperboard and Paper sales grew 8.8% as EBIT increased 13.4% on 90bps margin expansion led by lower input costs, higher in-house pulp and recovery in cigarette volumes. ITC completed rebuild of 1.5lakh ton machine for value added paperboards which will increase profitability in coming periods.
- Agri Business sales increased 12.8% however, EBIT declined 7.9% on 240bps margin decline. Although ITC had higher commodity exports, pressures on legal cigarette industry, firm leaf tobacco prices, damaged AP crop and lower export incentives impacted margins and profits. INR depreciation has restored some competitiveness in leaf tobacco exports.

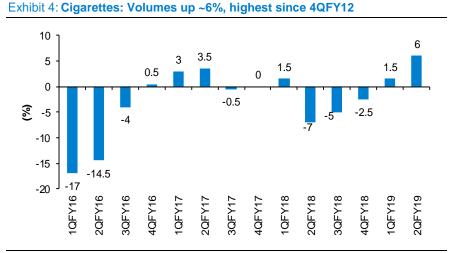

FMCG comparable sales up 14.3% led by Staples, Packaged foods, Personal care and Stationery; Lifestyle retailing remained sluggish.

Packagd food business growth led by Bingo snacks, Yippee noodles and consolidation of leadership in Aashirvaad Atta

Cake segment entered recently with Dark Fantasy Choco Jellifills and Bounce brands. ITC launched truflles range with Dessert collection under Fabelle

Personal care growth was led by Deo's, handwash and Body wash. ITC launched 4 essential oil variants under Fiama brand, Braille enabled packs in Savlon and reintroduced Charmis cream.

Hotels business performed well on higher ARR, operating leverage and recovery in F&B revenues
