Deccan Cements

Operationally efficient; retaining our Buy

Buoyed up by strong sales volumes in AP/Telangana, Deccan Cements reported firm revenue growth. With greater operating efficiencies, its de-leveraging exercise and rising government investment in its key markets, we expect a 22% CAGR in its PAT over FY18-20. We have a Buy recommendation on the stock, at a lower target price of ₹525.

Mounting demand. With rising demand in its key operating region (AP/Telangana), Deccan Cements, being a strong regional operator in the South, reported 25.8% y/y volume growth to 0.43m tons, resulting in revenue growing 19.3% to ₹1.63bn. We expect revenue to clock a 13% CAGR over FY18-20, aided by 8% volume growth at 77% capacity utilisation by FY20.

Better cost optimisation. Despite rising fuel and diesel prices, power & fuel cost per ton in Q2 FY19 slightly increased (2.4%), while freight costs per ton decreased 26.4%. Rising production costs offset realisation gains, resulting in EBITDA/ton declining 19.6% y/y to ₹495 (₹615 a year ago). We expect an EBITDA/ton of ₹622 by FY20 given the company's constant focus on cost rationalisation and the expected better pricing in the region.

De-leveraging exercise. With no major capacity expansion announced, the focus on de-leveraging is expected to continue. We expect PAT to register a 22% CAGR over FY18-20 and RoE and RoCE to improve to respectively ~13% and ~16% by FY20. With no capex planned so far for the next two years, we expect the net-cash position to improve considerably due to significant cash-flows and better return ratios.

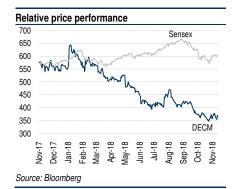
Valuation. A pick-up in demand and better pricing would lead to higher realisation in coming quarters. We maintain a Buy rating, at a lower target of ₹525 based on an EV/EBITDA of 6x in accord with the overall reduction in the Nifty valuation. **Risk**: High pet-coke prices.

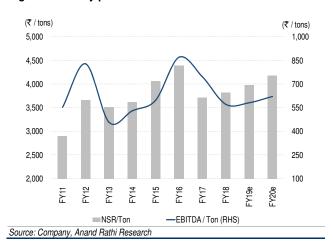
Fig 3 – Cash-flow statement (₹ m)

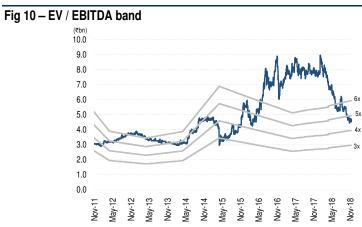
Other key highlights

Driven by the 25.8% rise in volumes to 0.43m tons, revenue stepped up a smart 19.3% y/y to ₹1.6bn despite realisations declining 5.5% y/y. And despite the rise in fuel and diesel prices, quarterly power & fuel cost per ton increased only a slight 2.4% y/y, though the freight cost per ton fell 26.4% y/y. Other expenses shot up 91.4% y/y. Thus, such a decline in realisation and rise in costs drove the 19.5% y/y fall in EBITDA/ton to ₹495. Strong revenue growth and higher other income (116.7% y/y) resulted in PAT increasing 7% y/y to ₹102m.

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Valuations

A better pricing and demand environment would lead to higher realisations in coming quarters. We maintain our Buy rating, at a revised target of ₹525 based on an EV/EBITDA of 6x.

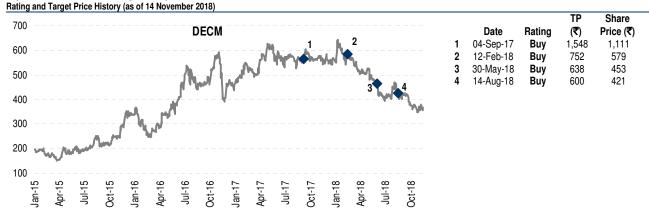
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
