Set up NIA courts or will give accused bail, SC warns govt

Senior advocate Trideep Pais argued that his client Kalash Ramchandran was arrested by NIA in a UAPA case and was lodged in jail for the last six years without trial as the judicial officer in charge of the court, had no time to proceed with the case.

The bench of Justices Surya Kant and Jaymaya Bagchi told additional solicitor-general Rajkumar B Thakre that this was the last opportunity for Union and Maharashtra govt to set up new special courts to exclusively deal with NIA cases. The bench said if such steps were not taken, then courts would be constrained to consider grant of bail to the accused in these cases on the ground of delay in trial.

Rejecting NIA's affidavit which claimed compliance with Supreme Court's order for establishment of special courts by designating existing courts, the bench said no effective or visible step was taken by the authorities.

With the enactment of a new law, trials pertaining to heinous offences have brought an enormous burden on the existing system." It has further said, "The most effective recourse can be the establishment of dedicated courts to whom trials under special statutes can be entrusted, without giving them any other civil or criminal cases. Ideally, the trial should take place on a day-to-day basis."

'Nationwide hunt on to locate Russian woman, minor child'

New Delhi: Delhi Police on Friday informed Supreme Court about a nationwide hunt to trace a Russian woman, estranged from her Indian husband, who has been missing with her minor son since July 7, and had sought to be in touch with the police no was no report of her leaving the country through legal channels.

After Vikram Bhati's husband accused her of breaching SC orders for shared custody of the child, a bench of Justices Surya Kant and Jaymaya Bagchi had on Thursday asked the Delhi Police commissioner to trace the woman and sought the Russian ambassador's cooperation in sending the addresses of some embassy officials who were close to her.

On Friday, additional solicitor general Ashwarya Bharti informed the court that ministries

In its last order, the Justice Kant-led bench had said, "There are hundreds of trials in different parts of the country under special statutes like UAPA, Indian Explosives Act, MCOCA and other similar statutes in different states. However, trials are not commencing because presiding officers are also occupied with several other criminal and civil cases. In the absence of a judicial audit of the matters, which are actually or likely to be generated

with the enactment of a new law, trials pertaining to heinous offences have brought an enormous burden on the existing system." It has further said, "The most effective recourse can be the establishment of dedicated courts to whom trials under special statutes can be entrusted, without giving them any other civil or criminal cases. Ideally, the trial should take place on a day-to-day basis."

Bhati also informed the court that the woman seemed to be in dire straits financially which was reflected from her bank account entries. "She had withdrawn Rs 220 from her account prior to her disappearance and only Rs 168 is remaining in the account," the ASG said.

Justices Kant and Bagchi asked the MHA to coordinate with the concerned embassies, embassies of other countries, foreign missions, Delhi Police and Freshlook (India) to locate the minor and other foreign nationals who were close to her.

On Friday, additional solicitor general Ashwarya Bharti informed the court that ministries

of external affairs (MEA) and home affairs (MHA) had taken coordinated steps to issue locational notices against the woman and the child to prevent them from leaving the country. The Indian embassy in Moscow had fully cooperated in the process to locate the woman, she said.

Bhati also informed the court that the woman seemed to be in dire straits financially which was reflected from her bank account entries. "She had withdrawn Rs 220 from her account prior to her disappearance and only Rs 168 is remaining in the account," the ASG said.

Justices Kant and Bagchi asked the MHA to coordinate with the concerned embassies, embassies of other countries, foreign missions, Delhi Police and Freshlook (India) to locate the minor and other foreign nationals who were close to her.

Serial sex offender, 55, shot dead in UP encounter

Agra: A 55-year-old serial sex offender, most recently accused of raping and murdering an eight-year-old girl in Mainpuri, was shot dead by police in an encounter in UP's Farrukhababad on Friday.

Manu Subhash, a resident of Pakhna village under Mehdaspur tehsil, Lakhimpur district, carries a alias of Rallakhan, his henchman. Acting on a tip-off, police teams surrounded him near his village. When cornered,

Manu opened fire. Police retaliated and shot him in the chest. He was rushed to the district hospital, where doctors declared him dead, said SP Arti Singh.

Police recovered a country-made pistol, live cartridges and his Aadhar card from the spot.

Described by officers as a "psychotic individual with deviant tendencies", Manu had a history of targeting minor girls. Police said he had a long criminal record with cases of murder, kidnapping for ransom, abduc-

tion and sexual assault registered at various police stations across Farrukhababad. He was arrested in 2017 in a kidnapping and ransom case and released in 2023. Soon after, police said, he resumed targeting young girls.

According to a senior officer involved in the investigation, Manu worked as a rag-picker, which gave him access to village alleys and school routes.

He would observe girls,

then offer sweets or trinkets to gain their trust. "Once familiar, he lured them away for assault. So far, eight girls aged 9 to 15 are believed to have been his victims," the officer said.

The autopsy confirmed rape and strangulation. Police registered a case under BNS sections 63(2) (sexual assault on a minor), 103 (murder), 137(2) (kidnapping) and relevant provisions of the PoCSO Act.
