In-line performance; outlook remains bright

CMP: INR1,339

Adani Ports & SEZ (APSEZ) reported a revenue growth of 19% YoY to INR68.9b in 4QFY24 (in line). During the quarter, APSEZ recorded 26% YoY growth in cargo volumes to reach 108.8 MMT.

TP: INR1,550 (+16%)

- EBITDA margin came in at 58.6% in 4QFY24 vs. our estimate of 59.4% (up 220bp YoY, down 190bp QoQ). While EBITDA grew 24% YoY to INR40.4b, APAT increased 11% YoY to INR22.9b (in line with our estimate).
- In 4QFY24, port revenues rose 24% YoY to INR54.7b and EBITDA margins stood at 70% (flat YoY). Logistics revenues grew 5% YoY to INR5.6b and EBITDA margins stood at 18.7% (vs. 24.8% in 4QFY23). During FY24, revenue increased 28% YoY to INR 267b, EBITDA grew 24% YoY to INR 158.7b, and APAT stood at INR89b (+16% YoY). APSEZ has declared a dividend of INR6 per share in FY24, with a total payout of INR13b.
- APSEZ reported a robust FY24 by handling 420 MMT of cargo volume, surpassing the management's revised cargo volume guidance of 400 MMT. Further, through debt reduction, APSEZ has achieved a net debt-to-EBITDA ratio of 2.3x vs. 3.1x in Mar'23.
- The 4Q performance was largely in line with our estimates. APSEZ is expected to record 2-3x of India's cargo volume growth, driven by a balanced port mix on the western and eastern coastlines of India and an operational ramp-up at the recently acquired ports. Further, the logistics business will also serve as a value addition to the domestic ports business with a focus on enhancing last-mile connectivity. We expect APSEZ to report 11% growth in cargo volumes over FY24-26. This would drive a CAGR of 14%/15%/19% in revenue/ EBITDA/PAT over FY24-26. We largely retain our estimates and reiterate our BUY rating with a revised TP of INR1,550 (based on 17x FY26E EV/EBITDA).

APSEZ surpasses cargo volume guidance in FY24, delivers 3x of India's cargo growth rate

- By handling 420MMT of cargo volume in FY24, APSEZ handled ~27% of the country's total cargo and ~44% of container cargo.
- APSEZ domestic cargo volumes grew by 21% YoY vs. 7.5% growth in India's cargo volumes in FY24. EBITDA margin of the domestic port business improved by ~150bp to ~72% in FY24 vs. 70% in FY23.
- APSEZ targets cargo volumes of 460-480 MMT in FY25. This would be driven by a ramp-up of newly acquired ports and higher utilization of existing ports.
 APSEZ sees a minimal impact of the Red Sea issue on its cargo volumes.

Last-mile connectivity to bolster growth in the Logistics business

- In 4QFY24, Adani Logistics (ALL) posted ~5% YoY growth in revenue and EBITDA margins of 18.7% (24.8% in 4QFY23).
- During FY24, APSEZ initiated a trucking business segment, deploying 900 trucks to offer last-mile connectivity for customers from ports, inland container depots (ICDs), and customer premises.

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ALL currently operates 12 multi-modal logistics parks (MMLPs), equipped with 127 trains, 2.4m sq. ft. of warehousing space, and 1.2mmt of grain silos. ALL plans to expand its footprint and build a pan-India presence in the form of logistic parks and warehouses.

Highlights from the management commentary

- APSEZ reported a record quarterly cargo volume of 108.8 MMT (+26% YoY). The proportion of non-Mundra domestic ports in the overall cargo distribution increased to 56% in FY24 from 54% in FY23.
- With the acquisition of Gopalpur and Karaikal ports, the total count of ports in India portfolio increased to 15 with total capacity of ~627 MMT as of Mar'24.
- Regarding the impact of the Red Sea on FY25 volume guidance, the management has stated that the company is not facing any challenges and any risks are covered by additional opportunities. APSEZ demonstrated resilience to the Red Sea issue, with a 12% YoY volume growth reported in Apr'24.
- During FY24, APSEZ initiated a trucking business segment, deploying 900 trucks to offer last-mile connectivity for customers from ports, inland container depots (ICDs), and customer premises.
- As per the management, cargo volumes are expected to range from 460 to 480 MMT in FY25, with revenue projected to be ~INR300b.

Valuation and view

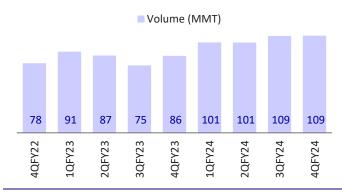
- APSEZ is anticipated to outpace India's overall growth, driven by a balanced port mix along India's western and eastern coastlines and a diversified cargo mix. The company continues to invest heavily in the ports and logistics business to drive growth. The newly launched trucking segment enables APSEZ to provide the last-mile connectivity solution to its customers.
- We expect APSEZ to report 11% growth in cargo volumes over FY24-26. This would drive a CAGR of 14%/15%/19% in revenue/EBITDA/PAT over FY24-26. We largely retain our estimates and reiterate our BUY rating with a revised TP of INR1,550 (premised on 17x FY26E EV/EBITDA).

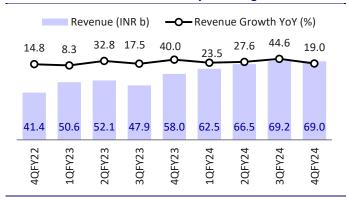

Exhibit 1: Port Cargo volume increased ~26% YoY



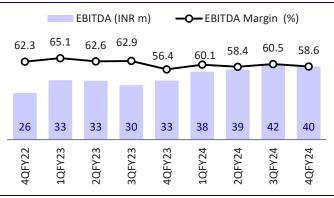

Exhibit 2: Growth in revenue led by volume growth



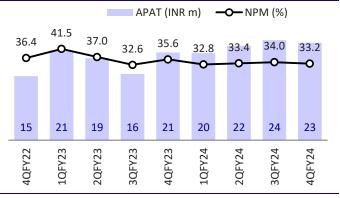

Exhibit 3: EBITDA and margin trends



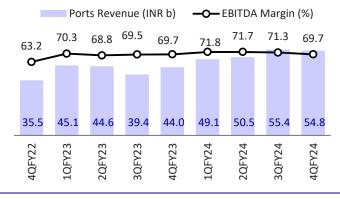

Exhibit 4: APAT increased 11% YoY



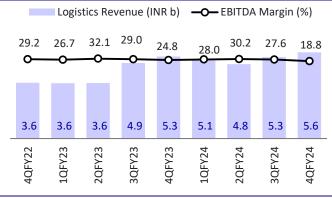

Highlights from the management commentary

Operational highlights

- APSEZ domestic cargo volumes grew 21% YoY vs. 7.5% growth in India's cargo volumes in FY24.
- A 26% YoY increase in cargo volume drove 19% YoY revenue growth to INR68.9b in 4Q. Domestic ports EBITDA margin expanded ~150bp, resulting in a 24% YoY EBITDA growth to INR40.4b.
- In 4Q, ports revenue grew 24% YoY to INR54.7b and EBITDA margins stood at 70% (flat YoY). Logistics revenue grew 5% YoY to INR5.6b and EBITDA margins stood at 18.7% (vs. 24.8% in 4QFY23).
- Net debt stood at ~INR387b at the end of 4QFY24 (INR399b at the end of FY23). The net debt-to-EBITDA ratio improved to 2.3x from 3.1x in Mar'23, despite a capex of INR74b.
- In FY24, APSEZ handled ~27% of the country's total cargo and ~44% of container cargo. Further, APSEZ recorded revenue growth of 28% YoY in FY24 to INR267b, supported by 30% YoY growth in ports revenue and 19% YoY growth in logistics business.
- APSEZ has declared a dividend of INR6 per share in FY24, with a total payout of INR13b. The management has guided for dividend payout of ~20%.

Port Vertical

- APSEZ reached a record quarterly cargo volume of 108.8 MMT (+26% YoY), with Mundra, its main port, achieving the highest-ever monthly volume for any Indian port in 4Q. Volumes at Mundra increased 19% YoY and EBITDA margin stood at 61% in 4QFY24 vs. 57% in 4QFY23.
- The proportion of non-Mundra domestic ports in the overall cargo distribution increased to 56% in FY24 from 54% in FY23.
- With the acquisition of Gopalpur and Karaikal ports, the total count of ports in India portfolio increased to 15 with total capacity of ~627 MMT as of Mar'24.
- Domestic cargo growth was ~3x India's growth rate, with 10 of the company's domestic ports/terminals recording their highest-ever cargo volumes in FY24.
- Additional growth in the Ports segment will be driven by Vizingham port, which is planned to be a transshipment terminal and a major EXIM cargo port in the coming years.
- Regarding the impact of the Red Sea issue on FY25 volume guidance, the management has stated that the company is not facing any challenges and any risks are covered by additional opportunities. APSEZ demonstrated resilience to the Red Sea issue, with a 12% YoY volume growth reported in Apr'24.

Logistics Business

- Logistics revenues grew 5% YoY to INR5.6b. EBITDA margins stood at 18.7% in 4QFY24 (24.8% in 4QFY23). Revenue growth in the logistics business was in line with cargo growth, although some agri-silos contracts with pending renewal have experienced reduced billing.
- ALL achieved its highest-ever Rail (+19%) and GPWIS (+40%) volumes in FY24.
- The count of MMLP has risen to 12 with the addition of Loni ICD, Valvada ICD and Virochannagar MMLP. Construction of Hyderabad MMLP has been initiated.
- The total number of rakes at the end of Mar'24 increased to 127 (115 rakes at the end of Dec'23).
- The total warehousing capacity in FY24 expanded to 2.4m sq. ft. with the inclusion of warehouses in NRC and Indore. Construction of ~0.2m sq. ft. of warehouses at Palwal (Phase 1) has been completed.
- During FY24, APSEZ initiated a trucking business segment, deploying 900 trucks to offer last-mile connectivity for customers from ports, inland container depots (ICDs), and customer premises.
- In the logistics business, initiatives include adding two more MMLP in North India and Mumbai (to be commissioned in the next two to three years), and increasing the rake count from 127 to 300 by FY28, primarily driven by GPWI and followed by the container business.

Guidance

- During FY25, cargo volumes are expected to range from 460 to 480 MMT, with revenue projected to be between INR290b and INR310b.
- EBIDTA is estimated to be in the range of INR170b to INR180b, with a net debt-to-EBITDA ratio of 2.2-2.5x.
- APSEZ has a capex target of INR115b in FY25, of which ~INR74b will be for the Ports business (incl. marine services capex), INR23b for the Logistics business, and ~INR15b for renewables (for decarbonization), under which the company plans to build 1,000MW of renewable power sources with a combination of both solar and wind. Solar panels are imported from China.
- Logistics business capex will be focused on last-mile connectivity, mainly trucking and warehousing.
- The management does not expect significant cargo volumes from Sri Lanka in FY25.
- The management guided that the commodity mix and ports mix are crucial for capturing maximum growth, aiming for a balanced growth of 10-15% in cargo volumes in FY25.

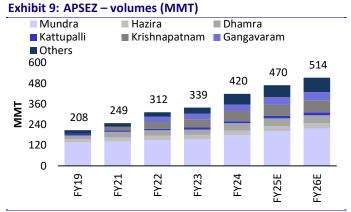

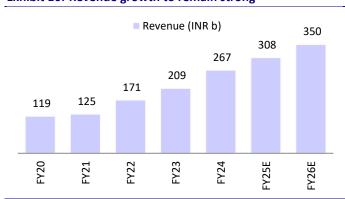

Exhibit 10: Revenue growth to remain strong



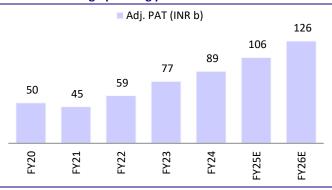

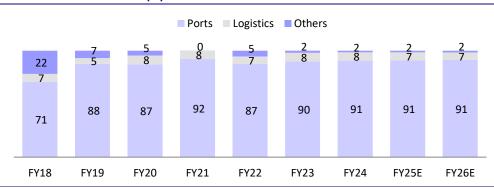

Exhibit 12: Strong operating performance to drive PAT



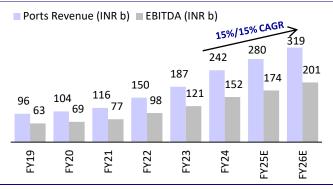

Exhibit 13: Revenue share (%)



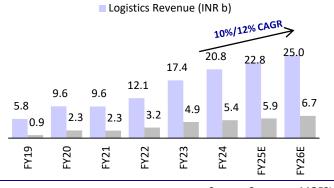

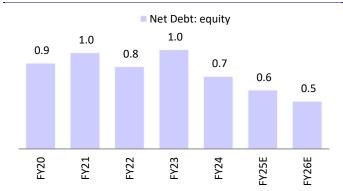
Exhibit 15: Logistics segment to report 10% CAGR in revenue

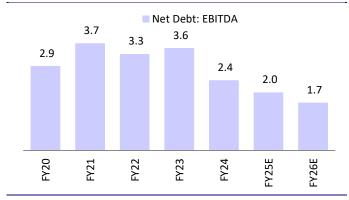
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Exhibit 16: Net debt/equity to decrease



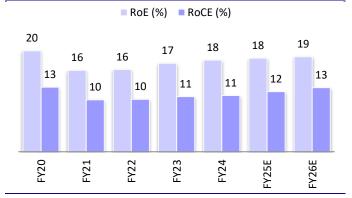

Exhibit 17: Net debt/EBITDA to improve with better efficiency



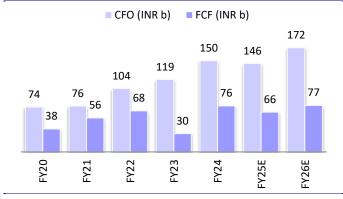

Exhibit 18: Return ratios to remain stable



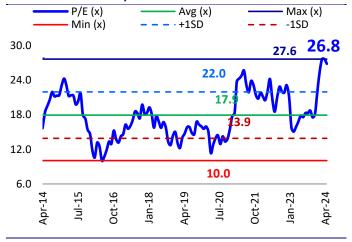

Exhibit 19: CFO and FCF generation to pick up



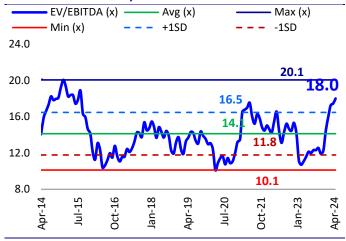
