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Expect margin recovery to set in 2H26

Quick Pointers:

- Cig volumes up ~6.0% (Ple 5.5%), low leaf tobacco prices to start benefitting from 3Q26 onwards
- FMCG and Paperboard margins improve QoQ, outlook positive

ITC reported a strong 6% volume growth in Cigarettes, while FMCG and paperboard reported higher margins QoQ. FMCG business sales were impacted due to pressure in stationary business and impact of GST transition. 8% sales growth ex notebooks and 50bps margin expansion despite trade support for GST transition is positive. Paper Business witnessed challenging quarter with sustained influx of low-priced supplies although imposition of MIP provided relief during the quarter.

However, we expect margin recovery to set in from 3QFY26 led by 1) Superior product mix in Cigarettes and usage of lower cost leaf tobacco 2) likely decline in wood prices and benefits of MIP imposition in paper board 3) expected recovery in demand and margins in FMCG business led by GST cuts and 4) stationary business losses will decline on imposition of ADD and GST removal. FMCG business has shown resilience with Digital First & Organic portfolio clocking Rs.11bn ARR while Food tech business has achieved Rs900mn in 1H26 (Rs1.05bn in FY25).

We estimate 9.9% EPS CAGR over FY26-28 (Ex century paper integration). We believe ITC offers a favorable risk reward at 21.5xSeptFY27 EPS and a dividend yield of 3.7%. We assign SOTP based target price of Rs530. Retain BUY.

2Q Revenue decline 3.4%, cigarette volumes grow 6% (Ple:5.5%): Revenues declined by 3.4% YoY to Rs180.2bn (PLe:Rs190bn). EBITDA grew by 2.1% YoY to Rs62.5bn (PLe: Rs64.1bn); Margins expanded by 186bps YoY to 34.7% (PLe:33.7%) Adj. PAT grew by 3% YoY to Rs50.9bn (PLe:Rs51.9bn).

2QFY26: Cigarette volumes up 6.0%, broad based margin pressure across segments

- Cigarette Revenues grew by 6.7% YoY to Rs87.2bn; EBIT grew by 4.3% YoY to 52.4bn. Margins contracted by 135bps YoY to 60.1% due to higher leaf tobacco prices. Volumes increased by ~6%.
- FMCG Revenues grew by 6.9% YoY to Rs59.6bn; EBIT declined by 0.3% YoY to 4.4bn. Margins contracted by 54bps YoY to 7.4% but expanded by 50bps QoQ despite volatile commodity costs and trade support or GST transition.
- Agri Revenues declined by 31.2% YoY to Rs39.7bn; EBIT grew by 1% YoY to 4.5bn. Margins increased by 368bps YoY to 11.5%.
- Paperboard & Paper Revenues grew by 5% YoY to Rs22.1bn; EBIT declined by 21.2% YoY to 1.9bn. Margins contracted by 286bps YoY to 8.6% but expanded by 90Bps QoQ on initial benefits of MIP imposition on paperboard.

Exhibit 2: Sales Mix: Cigarettes 41.8%, Agri 19%

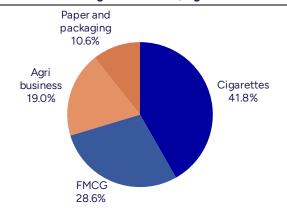
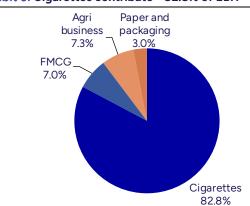


Exhibit 3: Cigarettes contribute ~82.8% of EBIT

Excessive rains and GST regime posed operational challenges, while Notebooks industry continues to remain impacted due to low priced paper imports. GST rates reduced for 50% of FMCG portfolio

FMCG EBIDTA margins at 10% (improved 50bps sequentially) amidst inflationary headwinds in input costs (edible oil, wheat, maida, cocoa, soap noodles)

Leaf Tobacco consumption cost remains elevated due to moderation in procurement prices witnessed in current crop cycle

Agri exports during the quarter were relatively subdued due to delayed calloffs by consumers amidst tariff issues

Paperboards remain impacted by lowpriced Chinese supplies in global markets, FY26 outlook bleak.

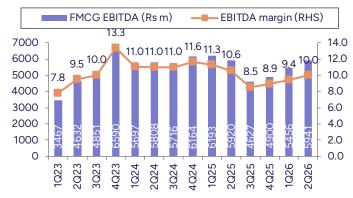

- Cigarette volumes grew ~6%; EBIT up 4.3%: Cigarette Revenues grew by 6.7% YoY to Rs87.2bn; EBIT grew by 4.3% YoY to 52.4bn. Margins contracted by -135bps YoY to 60.1% due to higher leaf tobacco prices. Volumes increased by ~6%. Leaf Tobacco consumption remains elevated and is likely to remain so till Nov25. ITC continued its focus on new launches and product innovations to drive volumes in a competitive scenario. We estimate 15-17% moderation in leaf tobacco procurement prices in current crop cycle. GST rates under sin goods have been announced at 40% (Est 48% under GST 1.0). we expect new rates under GST 2.0 to be implemented from fag end of Dec25 and be tax neutral. We expect gradual decline in leaf tobacco usage prices to support margins from 3Q/4Q26. Strategic portfolio and market interventions, with focus on competitive belts and to counter illicit trade, drive growth and reinforce market standing
- FMCG EBIT margins came at 7.4%, up 50bps QoQ: FMCG Revenues grew by 6.9% YoY to Rs59.6bn; EBIT declined by 0.3% YoY to 4.4bn. Margins contracted by 54bps YoY to 7.4% but expanded by 50bps QoQ. Excessive rains in many parts of the country and transition to the new GST regime posed operational challenges causing short-term business disruptions (50% of portfolio). However, stable growth and 60bps QoQ margin expansion in an environment of volatile commodity costs and trade support for GST transition is positive. We expect FMCG profitability to improve led by 1) GST reduction in key products like biscuits, processed foods and personal care and 2) turnaround in stationary business due to ADD/MIP and reduction in GST rates. we believe Stable growth and margins despite GST disruption and adverse weather is positive. We believe worst is over and expect steady expansion in margins in coming quarters.
- Paperboards, Paper & Packaging: Paperboard & Paper Revenues grew by 5% YoY to Rs22.1bn; EBIT declined by 21.2% YoY to 1.9bn. Margins contracted by 286bps YoY to 8.6% but expanded by 90Bps QoQ. Overall Industry remains impacted by low-priced supplies, high wood prices & subdued realization with Initial signs of moderation in wood prices. Strategic interventions continue to be made for improving wood availability including accelerating plantations in core areas, developing new areas, collaborating with other wood-based industries and implementing satellite-based plantation monitoring systems. ITC will benefit from imposition of MIP on paperboards, expected ADD on defaulting origins, ADD on Indonesia and safeguard duty on coated/uncoated paper. We believe worst is over for margins given benefits of MIP/ADD and expected easing off in wood prices. We expect significant growth in FY27 as acquisition of Century Paper is likely to be completed during FY26.
- Agri Business: Agri Revenues declined by 31.2% YoY to Rs39.7bn; EBIT grew by 1% YoY to 4.5bn. Margins increased by 368bps YoY to 11.5%. The Business continued to focus on scaling up Value-added agri portfolio (e.g. Aqua, Spices, Coffee) 2.2x over the last 4 years.
